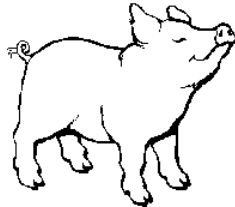

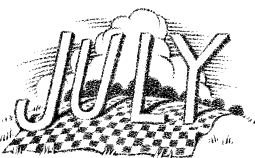

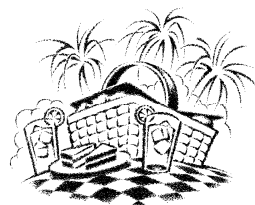


Other Opportunities to Serve

Old Fashioned Country Bazaar - CHRISTIAN WOMEN IN

SERVICE (CWS) is planning a new approach to the annual July Bazaar. This year, our bazaar which raises funds for the Christmas food baskets will be competing for limited dollars with the Mountain Forum for Peace Yard Sale; the Library Annual Book Sale; and the Miners' Days Silent Auction. Therefore we need your help.

The bazaar will no longer emphasize “Christmas In July”. Instead we are organizing an Old Fashioned Country Store, based on your donations of small useable white elephants, costume jewelry and handcrafts such as knitted hats, gloves, scarves, and mittens. As usual, we hope you will supply us with an abundance of home baked cakes, pies, cookies, candy, and breads.



The Ladies of CWS are preparing decorated jars of cookie mixes, bread mixes, soup mixes, and beverage mixes homemade and ready for use, or to give as gifts. There will be some craft items such as the popular casserole carriers, hot pads, and a few Christmas items. Houseplant cuttings will be for sale, as well as skeins from a large basket of assorted yarns donated to us. We will also have fabric swatches for quilts and other craft projects.

If you would like to help with this new venture or make donations of white elephants, jewelry or hand crafts, please contact Justine Irwin, Judy Anderson, or Judy Hubbard. Our storage space is limited so we must plan ahead.

For baked goods, look for the sign up sheets in the Fellowship Hall. Donations are to be brought to the church on Friday, July 24, after 1:00 PM.

From the Clerk of Session: Church Membership

According to the Book of Order of the Presbyterian Church (USA), the membership of a particular church (NCPC) includes baptized members, active members, inactive members and affiliate members.

A baptized member is a person who has received the Sacrament of Baptism; typically a child who has not made a profession of faith in Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior. (G-5.0201 Baptized Member)

An active member has made a profession of faith in Christ, has been baptized, has been received into membership of the church, has voluntarily submitted to the government of this church, and participates in the church's work and worship. (G-5.0202 Active Member)

An inactive member does not participate in the church's work and worship. An active member is moved to the inactive members' roll due to lack of participation in the church's work and worship, in the judgment of the Session. No active member is so transferred until that member has intentionally not participated in the work and worship of the church for a period of one year (G-10.0302 (3) (a) Inactive Members' Roll). A member who remains on the inactive roll for two or more years may be dropped from church membership. (G-5.0203 Inactive Member)

An affiliate member is an active member of another church who has temporarily moved to the Nederland community and has been received by the session as an affiliate member. Such membership must be reviewed and renewed on a biennial basis. In the past, many who regularly moved to Nederland for the summer were

received as affiliate members. Presently, the church has no affiliate members. (G-5.0204 Affiliate Member)

One of the Session's more challenging duties is to review the roll of members at least annually and make changes as noted in the Book of Order. This includes moving active members to the inactive list, moving inactive members off the church rolls, and reviewing, renewing, or dropping affiliate memberships. (G-5.0502 By the Session)

Such review is not the sole responsibility of the Session. "Accepting the privilege and responsibility of membership in the church is a commitment to Jesus Christ that binds the individual to fulfillment of the obligations of membership." Thus all members are encouraged to regularly review and evaluate their commitment to church membership and explore how their participation may be made more meaningful and fulfilling. (G-5.0501 By the Member)

Remember, all persons are welcome to participate in the life and worship of the church. Congregational care and ministry is not attached to any level of membership or participation in the church and its work. Membership relates directly to the agreement one makes when taking on the role of a member.
